JANUARY 2025 REPORT

GEORGE "JODY" SWEENEY, KENT COUNTY LEVY COURT COMMISSIONER, 5th DISTRICT



First of all, Happy New Year. I hope the new year brings you all of the joy and happiness you can handle.

Did You Know....? Continuing on with the theme of groups that impact our County, the Dover Kent Metropolitan Planning Organization is one of the most important in future planning for moving around our County. The Vision of the MPO is "The future transportation system in the Dover/Kent County Metropolitan region is safe, resilient, and sustainable, supports economic development, allows easy access and mobility for all people and goods to reach their destinations, and serves desired growth patterns in a manner that is fair and just to all people and respectful of community character and our natural environment." The MPO does this through meeting with most municipal governments, surveys of local leaders and elected officials, and many public engagement opportunities.

The Dover Kent MPO is made up of four subgroups: The Council, which consists of members appointed by State and local governments or members by virtue of their own rules; The Public Advisory Committee, which consists of members of the general public, also appointed by local government; The Technical Advisory Committee, which consists of professional members of Planning organizations throughout Kent County; And finally, and probably the most important of these groups, the staff of the Dover Kent MPO.

The MPO is mandated and mostly funded by the federal government through the Federal Aid Highway Act of 1962. They are an advisory organization that encourages collaboration among local governments, residents, and other interested parties. Much of the transportation funding that flows from the federal government to state and local governments is channeled through the MPO. There are more than 400 MPO's in the United States.

We all know that traffic impacts our lives on a daily basis. A bad commute to work, shopping, or a doctor's visit through heavy traffic can set the tone for the day. Well, your Dover Kent MPO is looking at that and planning improvements for the next 25 years. The MPO just completed more than a year's worth of meetings with government officials, public outreach, and presentations to share Innovations 2050, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan for the next 25 years. Updated every four years, this year the plan has themes that address Enhanced Mobility, Inter-Jurisdictional Coordination, Economic Vitality, Social Equity, Resilience & Sustainability, and improving User Experience on all modes of transportation. If you missed any of the many meetings that were held, you can go online to https://doverkentmpo.delaware.gov and view the videos or read the MTP for yourself. It is extremely interesting if you are concerned about traffic and growth in our County.

And the MPO isn't just about cars. The MPO is also looking at truck traffic and parking, light cargo and passenger rail, bicycle and pedestrian traffic.

On the MPO's website, you can also sign-up for the newsletter, get some questions answered, and find out when the next public meetings are to engage with one of the most critical groups in our County. I encourage you to check it out.


