October Birthstone Dazzling OPAL

From ancient Greece and Rome to Australia and the American West, the beauty and meaning of opal stones continues to fascinate generations of gem lovers.

Because of their enigmatic color, opals have been associated with rainbows, butterflies, and humming-birds in traditional folklore.

According to Bedouin folklore, opals fall from the sky during thunderstorms and get their marvelous color from lightning trapped within them.

Writers have compared opals to volcanoes, galaxies, and fireworks. Admirers gave extraordinary opals poetic names like Pandora, Light of the World, and Empress. In ancient Rome, this gem symbolized love and hope. The Romans gave it a name—opalus—that was synonymous with "precious stone."

In 75 AD, the Roman scholar Pliny observed, "Some opali carry such a play within them that they equal the deepest and richest colors of painters. Others...simulate the flaming fire of burning sulphur and even the bright blaze of burning oil." He marveled that this kaleidoscopic gem encompassed the red of ruby, the green of emerald, the yellow of topaz, the blue of sapphire, and the purple of amethyst.

Many cultures have credited opal with supernatural origins and powers. Arabic legends say it falls from the heavens in flashes of lightning. The ancient Greeks believed opals gave their owners the gift of prophecy and guarded them from disease. Europeans have long considered the gem a symbol of hope, purity, and truth. Opal is considered an October birthstone. Some people think it's unlucky for anyone born in another month to wear an opal. But that particular superstition comes from a novel written in the 1800s (Anne of Geierstein by Sir Walter Scott), and not from any ancient belief or experience. In fact, throughout most of history, opal has been regarded as the luckiest and most magical of all gems because it can show all colors. Once, it was thought to have the power to preserve the life and color of blond hair.

Harvest Years Report, October, 2020 George "Jody" Sweeney, Kent County Levy Court Commissioner, 5th District

New Beginnings

"Readers of the Harvest Years Monthly may know that I decided more than a year ago to retire from the State Senate at the end of my current term". That was how past Senator Brian J. Bushweller started his last monthly article in the Harvest Years Monthly. Senator Bushweller was a staunch supporter of those who lived in his District. Two years later, and the lack of his presence is felt in the halls of Dover. Senator Trey Paradee is doing a great job, but Senator Bushweller set the bar very high. It is with that in mind that I have agreed to follow in Senator Bushweller's footsteps to write a monthly article for the Harvest Years Monthly.

I always knew I would end up writing for someone. My father worked for the Delaware State News for 19 years, as a Pressroom Foreman, working with such notable people as Jack Smith and photographer Gary Emeigh. Gary mentioned my father in his recent photo-journal, Ink In My Blood. Now, when I see my dad again in the next life, I can tell him, "Dad, I have ink in my blood, too."

My hope is to focus on Kent County issues, promoting our County, and all the good that happens in it. You will read about upcoming events, and the changes that Your Kent County Levy Court votes on that impact your everyday life. I also watch the State Legislatures, so if there is something that happens in our State government, I will include that.

For those who do not know what Kent County Levy Court is, We were established in 1683, by King George. He established Levy Courts throughout the British Colonies all along the east coast. They were called "Levy" courts because they levied taxes. Since 1683, all of those government institutions changed their format to a County Council form of government, except for Kent County.

The difference between the two is that a levy court selects our President from among ourselves and we hire a County Administrator. A county council usually elects those positions along with Councilmembers. Otherwise, we have very similar roles in representing our constituents.

Levy Court is responsible for many things. Primarily, we are responsible for providing permits for land use and for property maintenance in lands that are outside municipal boundaries, although we have some agreements with a few small towns to provide those services. We are also responsible for transference of sewer from all towns and most subdivisions to a single, award-winning, wastewater treatment plant located in Frederica, Del. We provide Paramedic Advanced Life Support services for the entire county. I hope you never have to use that service, but if you do, know that they are also award-winning, and a high priority for this Levy Court.

In addition to those services, we are, of course, a tax collection agency. Not just for the County government, but also for library services and public school districts. In my next article, I will share all about your property tax bill and what the lines all mean. In other future articles, I will go into that and to the rest of the services more deeply with some great statistics about them and how they operate.

I sincerely appreciate the opportunity to share my knowledge about Levy Court with all of you. Thank you to Diane Amoroso and Tom Bones for their confidence in me to follow in Senator Bushweller's footsteps. They are some big shoes to fill. I will give it all I have got.
