Easy Ham & Cheese Quiche



What You'll Need

- 1 refrigerated pie crust (from a 14.1-ounce package)
- 2 cups shredded Swiss cheese
- 2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese
- 1 1/2 cups diced cooked ham
- 4 eggs
- 2 cups half-and-half

WHAT TO DO:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Place pie crust in a 9-inch deep dish pie plate and flute edges.
- In a medium bowl, combine Swiss and Cheddar cheeses; mix well. Place half the cheese mixture in the pie shell, then top it with the ham and remaining cheese.
- 3. In a small bowl, whisk eggs and half-and-half; pour evenly over top.
- 4. Bake 50 to 55 minutes, or until center is set. Cool 10 minutes before serving.

NOTE: Swiss and Cheddar cheeses are traditional for quiche, but you could certainly use a combination of whatever kinds you've got left over. You could start a tradition of having a different flavor combination every time you make it!

Bodily functions. Everybody has them. Most know what happens when you flush your toilet, wash your dishes, take a shower, or brush your teeth. Everything goes into a pipe and is washed away from your house. For most, that is all you know and all you really care about. But, there is so much more.

For those on their own sewer system, waste water goes into a tank where the solids gather, but the liquids drain off and go into a drain field to be filtered back into the Earth.

But for every Kent County household in a municipality or in subdivisions that are connected to Kent County's Sewer District #1, all waste goes to a single location: The Kent County Regional Resource Recovery Facility (KCRRRF) located in Frederica, Delaware.

In both of these situations, you are benefitted by the KCRRRF, better known as the Wastewater Treatment Plant. If you have your own septic system, you should be getting it pumped every 2-3 years to remove the solids that cannot dissolve. After the Honeypot Truck pulls those solids from your tank, it goes to a KCRRRF receiving area and unloads, so that all waste goes to our Frederica plant. If you live in Clayton, Smyrna, Hartly, Kenton, Dover, Camden-Wyoming, Kitts Hummock, Pickering Beach, Harrington or Milford, or the Dover Air Force Base, your waste finds its way to this facility too.

The Kent County Sewer System encompasses the entirety of Kent County. It includes 253 miles of gravity piping where the downhill flow is maintained by lift stations. Since it is not all downhill here in Kent County, there are 177 miles of forcemain piping, where the flow is maintained by pump stations. The KCRRRF is located on about 100 acres of land south of Frederica and includes infiltration screens, grit chambers, two 10 million gallon aeration basins, 2 natural gas-fired thermal heaters, 3 thermal biosolids dryers, 3 solar biosolids dryers, 66 passive solar water heaters, and 1 sand filter.

This facility processes more than 12 million gallons of waste on a sunny day, with much more on a rainy day. The waste is screened for metals and grit. Solids are separated and dried in natural gas or solar dryers, and sold to area farms as Kentorganite, as a soil amendment with nutrients as a side component. The liquids are aerated, treated to kill bacteria and other agents, passed through a sand filter, and then released into the Murderkill River as effluent, clean and nature-friendly.

The KCRRRF has received many national awards since 1997, including the 2011 US EPA Region III, Performance and Innovation in the STRF Creating Environmental Success (Pisces), the 2012 DE Chapter of American Council of Engineering Companies (ACEC) "Grand Conceptor" award, the 2012 American Academy of Environmental Engineers, Excellence in Environmental Engineering, Small Firm Grand Award, and most recently, the 2016 Inaugural Utility of the Future Award.

So, the next time you flush, think about where it is all going. The Kent County Public Works Department and all their 72 great, hard-working, employees are here to handle it, and they do it very well.




