20th Anniversary

I bet you didn't know about this after Flight 77 hit the Pentagon on 9/11 - *The following happened*:

A daycare facility inside the Pentagon had many children, including infants who were in heavy cribs. The daycare supervisor, looking at all the children they needed to evacuate, was in a panic over what they could do. There were many children, mostly toddlers, as well as the infants who would need to be taken out with their cribs. There was no time to try to bundle them into carriers and strollers.

Just then a young Marine came running into the center and asked what they needed. After hearing what the center director was trying to do, he ran back out into the hallway and disappeared. The director thought, "Well, here we are, on our own again." About 2 minutes later, that Marine returned with 40 other Ma-

About 2 minutes later, that Marine returned with 40 other Marines in tow. Each of them grabbed a crib with a child, and the rest started gathering up the toddlers.

The director and her staff then helped them take all the children out of the center and down toward the park near the Potomac. Once thy got about 3/4 of a mile outside the building, the Marines stopped in the park, and did a fabulous thing - they formed a circle with the cribs, which were quite sturdy and heavy, like the covered wagons in the Old West.


Inside this circle of cribs, they put the toddlers, to keep them from wandering off. Outside this circle were the 40 Marines, forming a perimeter around the children and waiting for instructions.

The thought of those Marines and what they did and how fast they reacted; could we expect any less from them? It was one of the most touching stories from the Pentagon.

It's the military, not the politicians that ensures our right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. It's the military who salutes the flag, who serves beneath the flag, and whose coffin is draped by the flag.

SEPTEMBER 2021 REPORT

GEORGE "JODY" SWEENEY, KENT COUNTY LEVY COURT COMMISSIONER, 5th DISTRICT



Kent County P.R.I.D.E.

Did you know that Kent County has an online system that allows you to look up county tax information? We call it P.R.I.D.E., and it stands for Phone Retrieval and Inquiry and Data Exchange.

The PRIDE system gives you access to public records with information concerning tax parcels in the County. If you know some simple information about a parcel, such as the address or owner name, you can look up the sales history, the square footage of any homes built on the property, number of bedrooms, and assessed value of the land and buildings, among other data about the property.

Many owners' property taxes are paid from escrow accounts associated with their mortgages. When you are notified by the mortgage company that your property taxes were paid and that they may have gone up, this could impact your mortgage payment to cover the escrow amount needed. Most of the time, it is assumed that "county" taxes are what drove your property taxes higher, when in fact it was some other line that caused the increase. Through the PRIDE system, you can look up your property taxes and history of those taxes to see just how much those lines have increased or decreased over the years.

A couple of years ago, my property taxes increased by nearly \$148. I was able to use PRIDE to determine that both my County Tax and School Tax increased as a result of a reassessment after I completed work from a permit. To me, it was very useful to have that

At a recent Kent County Levy Court meeting, the Director of Information Technology and a staff member, displayed a new Property Information website that will soon be available to the public. All of the information that was available from the previous website will still be viewable. It will be in a very readable tab format. You will be able to click on tabs for "Buildings", "Sales", "Billing", and

You will also be able to click on "Pay Online" next to your Total Due and pay via on online. There is a convenience fee associated with paying online, but it is worth it when mail service is still in recovery from the coronavirus pandemic.

One box under the "Summary" tab includes what Fire and Ambulance Districts you belong to. That would be a great place to donate to help them recover from more than a 18 months of revenue loss due to the coronavirus. That box also includes a link to your Levy

As part of your community all of this information is Public Record. I hope you will check it out.


