History of the Marine Corps War Memorial



"In honor and in memory of the men of the United States Marine Corps who have given their lives to their country since November 10, 1775."

The **United States Marine Corps War Memorial** represents this nation's gratitude to Marines and those who have fought beside them. While the statue depicts one of the most famous incidents of World War II, the memorial is dedicated to all Marines who have given their lives in defense of the United States since 1775. The tiny island of Iwo Jima lies 660 miles south of Tokyo. Mount Suribachi, an extinct volcano that forms the narrow southern tip of the island, rises 550 feet to dominate the ocean around it. US troops had recaptured most of the other islands in the Pacific Ocean that the Japanese had taken in

1941 and 1942. In 1945 Iwo Jima became a primary objective in American plans to bring the Pacific campaign to a successful conclusion.

On the morning of February 19, 1945, the 4th and 5th Marine Divisions invaded Iwo Jima after an ineffective 72-hour bombardment. The 28th Regiment of the 5th Division, was ordered to capture Mount Suribachi. They reached the base of the mountain on the afternoon of February 21 and, by nightfall the next day, had almost completely surrounded it. On the morning of February 23, Marines of Company E, 2nd Battalion, started the tortuous climb up the rough terrain to the top. At about 10:30 am men all over the island were thrilled by the sight of a small American flag flying from atop Mount Suribachi. That afternoon, when the slopes were clear of enemy resistance, a second, larger flag was raised in the same location.

NOVEMBER 2021 REPORT

GEORGE "JODY" SWEENEY, KENT COUNTY LEVY COURT

Recovery from the economic disaster that was caused by the coronavirus is a daunting task. Amid all of the politics that surround not only vaccinations and masking is how we give the economy the boost it needs to kick start a recovery.

The Biden Administration and majority of Senators and congress people have hopefully done that. As part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), Kent County, Delaware will receive around \$35 million. Levy Court Commissioners are in the midst of discussions about how best to utilize that funding to ensure a recovery here in Kent County is successful. Keep in mind that none of this has been voted on by your Commissioners.

The federal government has detailed how state and local governments can allocate their funds. They include:

- Support for Public Health Response (cost associated with medical, behavioral health, public safety, human services)
- Mitigation of Negative Economic Impacts (assistance to households, small business, non-profits, or severely impacted industries, such as tourism, travel, hospitality)
- Revenue Reduction Offsets (recover lost revenue)
- Infrastructure Investments (drinking water, sanitary sewer, storm water management, green infrastructure, climate change, flood protections)
- Transfers to State Government
- Transfers to Authorized Entities (non-profits, public benefit corporations, state or local government special purpose units)
- Premium Pay for Essential Workers (those who continued to work with heightened risk, had regular in-person contact)

The county identified a few groups to provide advice.

The Central Delaware Chamber of Commerce and Kent County Tourism recently provided a proposed grant program for small business and tality sectors. Organizations in these groups must demonstrate a new revenue loss directly attributable to COVID from March, 2020 through March, 2021.

We are waiting for proposals from focus groups on public safety, intergovernmental transfers and a non-profits. Finally, Kent County is also seeking to partner with a firm to develop, implement, and administer a plan to utilize ARPA funding in accordance with the provisions of the United States Treasury's Final Rule.

We are very aware of the impact COVID has had on our lives here in Kent County. With more than 430 of our family members whom have died, the serious impact on first responders, both physically and mentally, and the mental strain on every one of us, we are in a unique position to help many people through this pandemic. We are confident that the result will have a great overall positive impact on the lives of those we represent in Kent County.

But even with the financial burden lessened by these funds, we have a long way to go. Please get vaccinated to protect yourselves and mask up to protect those around you.

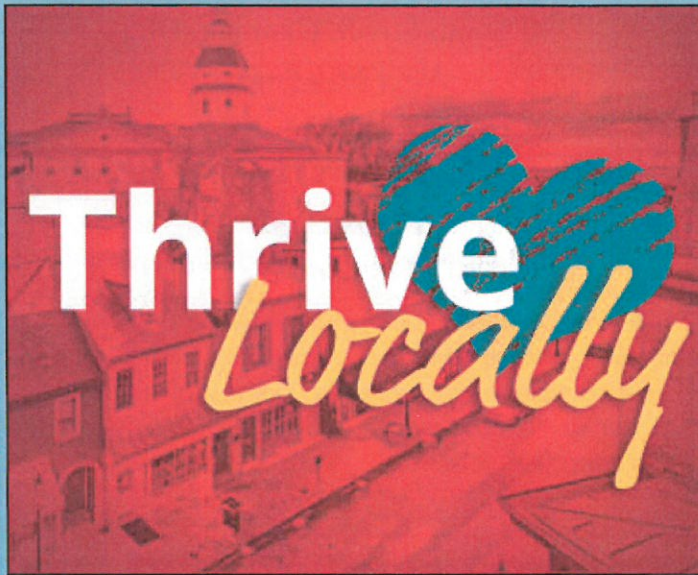

Making of a Memorial



Joe Rosenthal of the Associated Press caught the afternoon flag-raising in an iconic photograph that eventually won a Pulitzer Prize. Sculptor Felix W. de Weldon, then on duty with the U.S. Navy, was so moved by the image that he constructed first a scale model and then a life-size model of it. Rene Gagnon, Ira Hayes, and John Bradley posed for the sculptor as he modeled their faces in clay. These three men were believed to be the survivors of the famous flag raising (the others were killed on Iwo Jima). The US Marine Corps has since concluded that John Bradley was not in the famous image of the flag raising. To learn more about the identities of the flag raisers, please read the [US Marine Corps statement on the Iwo Jima flag raisers](#). All available pictures and physical statistics of the three who had given their lives were collected and then used in the modeling of their faces.

Once the statue was completed in plaster, it was carefully disassembled and trucked to Brooklyn, N.Y., for casting in bronze. The casting process, which required the work of experienced artisans, took nearly 3 years. After the parts had been cast, cleaned, finished, and chased, they were reassembled into approximately a dozen pieces--the largest weighing more than 20 tons--and brought back to Washington, D.C. by a three-truck convoy. Here they were bolted and welded together, and the statue was treated with preservatives.

President Dwight D. Eisenhower dedicated the memorial in a ceremony on November 10, 1954, the 179th anniversary of the U.S. Marine Corps.
