#### **MEDICARE FRAUD ALERT**

#### Lab Owner Charged in \$53 Million Scheme

Florida laboratory owner Daniel Hurt, already charged in Pittsburgh in a \$25 million Medicare cancer screening fraud at Elwood City Medical center, has been charged again in New Jersey in a similar \$53 million kickback scheme.

Hurt owned several clinical labs that conducted or arranged for medical tests and paid kickbacks and bribes to entities who supplied referrals for genetic cancer screening test for Medicare beneficiaries who had no need for the screenings, federal prosecutors said.

The labs submitted claims to Medicare for the tests and Medicare paid without knowing the screenings were fraudulent or procured through the payment of kickbacks.

From January 2019 to October 2021, Hurt's labs submitted about 350,000 claims to Medicare, including 8,700 claims from beneficiaries in New Jersey, prosecutors said.

As a result, Medicare paid the labs at least \$53.3 million, and Hurt received at lest \$26.9 million.

In 2018 and 2019 prosecutors said Hurt and his co-conspirators obtained cheek swabs from thousands of Medicare beneficiaries across the U.S. and had the specimens sent to the hospital, which had no equipment to do the testing. Hurt directed the staff to send the specimens to outside labs with Medicare paying the bills. To secure those reimbursements, Hurt and his cohorts obtained prescriptions from telemedicine doctors who didn't do any exams and weren't treating the patients for cancer.

Medicare paid the hospital \$25 million, which Hurt had transferred to accounts that he controlled.

Prosecutors said Hurt used \$3 million of the money to buy a boat in Florida he named "In My DNA."

The Delaware Senior Medicare Patrol educates Medicare beneficiaries about fraud and abuse and how to prevent, detect, and report it. This report will illustrate that people actually do get caught and must face the consequences of their acts.

## GEORGE "JODY" SWEENEY, KENT COUNTY LEVY COURT COMMISSIONER, 5th DISTRICT



One of Kent County's primary functions is the safety and aesthetics of structures in unincorporated areas, which are areas outside the municipal boundaries of our towns. Safety of structures is paramount. The County's Code Enforcement department follows the adopted codes of the 2018 International Plumbing Code, the 2011 National Electric Code, and the 2018 International Building Code and Residential Code. It is these codes that guide every inspection that occurs during and after construction of new homes, new commercial buildings, or additions to structures.

During the process, the County has defined exactly when an inspection is required before moving on to the next steps of construction. When anyone applies for a permit, the County Inspections Department will let the applicant know when the inspections occur. These inspections insure that construction meets the code requirements, that all safety aspects of the construction are being followed, and that final construction will warrant a Certificate of Occupation for the homeowner to move in or for the business to open.

Many developments have Deed Restrictions that are guidelines for their aesthetics, enforced by their Home Owner Associations. These restrictions are specific to the development, and can be more restrictive than County Code. When there is a violation, if the violator does not resolve the violation, it could cost the HOA funds to litigate the issue in Chancery Court as a civil violation. It also pits neighbor versus neighbor, which is never a good situation. Unfortunately, the County cannot get involved in these situations. There are more than 200 subdivisions in Kent County, all with no restrictions, some restrictions, many restrictions, and a few that are far-reaching. By state law, those restrictions were shared with the homeowner when they purchased the property and agreed to. If you are not aware of those restrictions, contact your HOA.

But, what about issues like tall grass, junky yards, general disrepair, a neighbor with a new shed crossing your property line, or a tree with branches that overhang into your space? If you are not in a development, or your HOA is non-functioning or they do not enforce their covenants, these are situations that the County can help to enforce, because they violate County Code. Kent County is complaint-driven when it comes to code violations. Kent County does not have a County Police Force and does not depend on the Delaware State Police to enforce code. What we have is a few Enforcement Officers who respond to complaints. Those complaints come from neighbors who have to tolerate those conditions or have their own property values reduced because of living next door to those conditions.

So if you have a complaint that falls into these categories, you can call Kent County Code Enforcement (302) 744-2451, or contact your Levy Court Commissioner. You can request anonymity to prevent your violating neighbor from retaliating.
